Project Highlights

Tollway Roadway Lighting and ITS Work

JBCC completed the installation of a Ramp Toll Plaza for the Illinois Tollway located at Roselle Road in Schaumburg, IL. This included setting a prefabricated control building, complete inside wiring of all electrical and communication systems and installing the Violation Enforcement System (VES) washer for the Toll Plaza cameras.




Hundreds of feet of conduit were installed into ITS (Intelligent Transportation System) cabinets and buildings which are responsible for communicating traffic patterns, maintaining the newly installed LED lighting, and informational signs along I-90.







JBCC installed over 400 light poles with LED fixtures on Interstate 90 this past summer between Hoffman Estates to Rosemont, which totaled over 20 miles! In addition to the lights on I-90, JBCC installed new LED lights on the Meacham Road Bridge over I-90. This included new decorative light poles to improve bridge aesthetics and pedestrian friendly walkways over the Interstate.

Wolf Point Intersection Improvements Project

JBCC worked on the new Wolf Point West Project in River North, Chicago. Work included upgrading 9 traffic signal systems at the busiest traffic signal intersections within the Central Business District of the City of Chicago: Orleans & Hubbard St., Kinzie & Wells St., Wells & Merchandise Mart Dr., Wacker Dr. & Lake St., Wacker Dr. & Wells St., Hubbard St. & Wells St., Wacker Dr. & Orleans (Franklin) St., Orleans St. / Merchandise Mart Dr. / Wolf Point Dr., Lake St./Canal St. / Milwaukee Ave.

JBCC work included the installation of new traffic signal poles, controller, countdown pedestrian signal heads, vehicle detection cameras, sidewalk, asphalt, and pavement markings. JBCC also installed conduit, electrical cable, and a brand new traffic intersection at Kinzie & Kingsbury.



The project was completed during off-peak time and nighttime hours in order to reduce overall impact on the travelling public.









Project Highlights

Lakefront Flyover – CDOT Lighting

John Burns Construction Company is scheduled to complete the installation of 905 LED light fixtures on the Lakefront Flyover Pedestrian Bridge, as well as traffic signal and underpass lighting modifications in September of 2017. This bridge will eventually connect the Lakefront Trail from the south end to the north end near Ohio Street Beach. JBCC was closely involved in several mock ups that took place to ensure the construction and layout of the light fixtures conformed to the design and vision proposed by the architect.







When completed, this path will provide a safer walking and biking route along the Lakefront Trail near Navy Pier, which is one of the most heavily used portions of the 18.5 mile trail system.

UPRR High Speed Rail Fiber Install

JBCC performed directional boring of over 200,000 feet (>37 miles) of HDPE duct for fiber optic installation between Bloomington and Joliet.

Project highlights included underground boring and conduit installation along the Union Pacific Railroad Right of Way from Bloomington to Joliet. JBCC's scope of work included installing conduit, tying conduit into all Union Pacific control huts, and the installation of handholes and vaults. Directional boring included many bores underneath the tracks as well as waterways along the route. JBCC

employees used their extensive experience and knowledge to successfully complete underground boring installation parallel to existing high profile ComEd, Level 3 Communications, Sprint, AT&T, water lines, and gas lines.

Over 300 hand holes, vaults, and tie-ins to 115 UPRR signal huts were completed.

Project Highlights

ISTHA Salt Barn Replacement (M-6) & Salt Dome Repairs (M-4, M-5 & M-8)

JBCC provided general contracting services for the Illinois Sate Toll Highway Authority Salt Barn Replacement (M-6) & Salt Dome Repairs (M-4, M-5 & M-8) project. JBCC replaced the existing salt dome at the M-6 maintenance yard in Hampshire, IL with a 45′ tall 13,000 SF pre-engineered wood truss salt barn. This salt barn can hold more salt than the existing domes and provides ISTHA with a more efficient facility. In addition to the salt barn replacement at the M-6 maintenance yard, three existing deteriorating salt domes (M-4, M-5 & M-8) were repaired.

In addition to the pre-engineered wood truss and roofing construction, the project highlights at the M-6 maintenance yard include the demolition of an existing salt storage shed, a 115' diameter salt dome, existing site drainage lines, asphalt pavement, fencing and curbs. The site work to accommodate the construction of the new salt barn at M-6 consisted of the installation of a new drainage system and a detention pond. The cast-in-place concrete foundation of the new salt barn was constructed as part of this project and consisted of a 12' wide shallow-spread footing along with 12' high concrete walls. Additionally, six (6) 9' tall 12'x16' cast-in-place concrete material storage bins were constructed. The newly constructed salt barn was furnished with motion sensor LED light fixtures. The site work and the new salt barn at M-6 were constructed in under 4 months.



The salt dome repair scope of work for this project at M-4, M-5 & M-8 consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing asphalt shingle roofs, metal flashings & gutters, and the structural carpentry that was deteriorating. The existing interior and exterior light fixtures were removed and replaced with motion sensor LED light fixtures. The repair of these existing domes took place without shutting down ISTHA salt operations at any point.

IDOT 60W75 High Mast Tower Replacement

JBCC replaced the entire roadway lighting system for the Illinois Department of Transportation at the US-55 and IL-171 interchange in Summit, IL. JBCC removed forty-three high mast light towers, forty-eight light poles, installed 34,000 LF of HDPE duct with cable, and pulled 30,000 LF of cable in conduit. JBCC erected thirty-nine high mast light towers totaling 206 new 400W fixtures. The new towers replaced 130 existing

750W fixtures, providing a more robust lighting distribution for the renovated interchange. JBCC stood thirty-nine new street light poles on south-bound IL-171. Lastly, JBCC replaced fifteen swivel navigation lights over the Chicago Sanitary & Ship Canal improving serviceability and reliability for the barges.

Safety Theme & Goals

The 2017 John Burns Construction Company's safety theme is "Safety is not an addition to what we do, it's what we do." The construction industry can be very dangerous and the U.S. Department of Labor reports that over one million construction workers are injured in the workplace every year. Unsafe behavior is the determining factor in almost 90% of all accidents. This statistic shows that we do have a great deal of control when it comes to preventing accidents. At JBCC, safety is a personal commitment that we each make to ourselves, teammates, and families every day. Choose to work the right way, avoid short cuts and remember you should never have to tolerate unsafe job site conditions.

At JBCC we approach our safety goal as a total team effort. Planning and communication across our company is what makes our Safety Program successful. Our safety planning begins for each project during our pre-construction meetings. At this stage of project planning we determine the biggest hazards associated with the job and

determine the equipment needed to safely accomplish the work. Next, JBCC's Labor Leaders assign a team to the project that is experienced and trained in the hazards associated with the job tasks. Finally, JBCC Field Foremen are responsible for holding Daily Job Briefs prior to beginning work each day, making sure to address the potential dangers they are facing and communicating their plan to work safely to the rest of the crew.

Increasing our safety knowledge through training is the key to making Zero Accidents a reality. In 2017, we will continue to pursue new avenues to improve our Safety Program and be a leader in the industry while pursuing our goal of zero accidents.
